Pediatrics experience:

- PGY-1: Peds ED for 4 weeks
- PGY-2: PICU for 4 weeks, Peds ED for 4 weeks, NICU for 2 weeks, Peds Anesthesia {longitudinal}
- PGY-3: Peds ED for 4 weeks
